

On August 16, 1983 Jeanne Nelson held an organizational meeting of the Nelson Lake Property Owners Association at the Ranch Supper Club in Hayward "to ascertain if there is interest in forming such an organization in the first place". 106 signed in at the door, about 40 couldn't get in, and she received an additional 29 letters of interest. 14 people volunteered to draw up a set of bylaws. That was the start of what today is the Nelson Lake Association with 273 families as members. During the 25 years that have passed since that first meeting a lot of water has gone over the dam (please excuse the pun) and we are planning to celebrate this milestone both at the annual meeting June 14th and at the fall picnic on August 9th. We don't have all the plans in place yet but I can assure you that you will not want to miss either event.

SEPTIC SURVEY by Bill Wilcox

During the past summer we sent information to 445 property owners on Nelson Lake with information about a proposed septic survey and asked them to respond if they approved or disapproved of conducting a septic survey. We received 293 (66%) responses and of the responses, 263 (90%) voted yes and 30 (10%) voted no. We will send this information to Sawyer County Zoning and ask them to put us in the queue for a future survey. The earliest a survey could be conducted is 2009 and in all probability it will be later than that. Before anything happens on this subject we will have additional information meetings and provide additional written notification.

Board of Directors meetings are held the second Wednesday of the months of January, March, May, July, September and November at The Lenroot Town Hall, 6:30 PM.

The golf pitching contest was won by Linda Solomonson and Phil Cooper while the Sno-Scoot contest was won by Kathy Button and BJ Eytcheson.





Operating a boat in excess of the speed limit or in a prohibited area


Operating a boat at night without the required lights


Operating a boat that is towing a water-skier without a required observer


Failure to display proper registration

Aquatic Invasive—Report on NLA Activities Dale Anderson

Aquatic Invasive Species - 2008 Plan

The Nelson Lake Association has a history of initiatives to fight the spread of aquatic invasive species. This has been accomplished by a combination of financial assistance from the DNR, donations, and dedicated NLA volunteers. We are planning on continuing in 2008, and in fact, want to expand the effort. The emergence of viral hemorrhagic septicemia (VHS) as a potentially catastrophic agent highlights the need for continuing vigilance.

We have applied for a DNR cost share grant of \$11,400 (25% for NLA and 75% for DNR) to help fund the project that focuses on three areas - education, prevention and early detection. First, the key chains we have made have been a very popular education tool and we will again make and distribute them in the region. Second, to prevent infestation of the lake we want to significantly expand the Clean Boat/Clean Water program that was initiated in 2007. We will use paid and volunteer inspectors to staff launch ramps and will hire a coordinator to oversee the program. We want to have extensive coverage at resort and public boat ramps. Finally, we will continue lake monitoring to ensure early detection should an invasive plant slip through the prevention efforts.

The proposal is aggressive and will require a lot of volunteer work to make it successful. Also, it is important to know that volunteer time is credited at \$8 / hour as part of the costs that are the responsibility of the Nelson Lake Association. We can nearly pay for our share of the cost through volunteer hours - every volunteer hour is worth \$8 to NLA.

We will know in early April if we got the DNR grant. If we do not, we still will have a STOP INVASIVES program! It will be less comprehensive, but will still include actions to protect the lake.

MINNOWS AS BAIT

Preventing the spread of VHS Fish Virus New Rules, November 2007

New statewide emergency regulations ban moving live fish and water between lakes.

Under the statewide rules:

You may not leave the bank or shore of any water with any live fish or live fish eggs, including leftover minnows.

You must drain all water from bilges, ballast, live wells, bait buckets and other containers before you leave the bank or shore of any water.

You may not use or possess live fish or live fish eggs as bait if bought outside Wisconsin.


You may not use dead fish, fish eggs, or fish parts for bait. Exceptions: if you are fishing in the same water where the bait was collected, or if the bait was preserved by a method that does not require refrigeration or freezing.


You may not transport by land into Wisconsin, any water in boats, boat trailers, boating equipment or fishing equipment, including water in any bilge, ballast tank, bait container or live well.

Also, because all water is required to be drained from equipment and containers used for fishing, this includes water in containers that may contain leeches or aquatic insects, or melted ice water in coolers used to keep dead fish fresh.

Another suggestion from the DNR, buy only enough minnows to use every day, or leave the bulk of minnows in your vehicle at the landing and take a few minnows out on the lake at a time so you will not have to kill all of them at the end of the day. Any minnows not brought onto the water, its shores or banks, can be taken home at the end of the day and used elsewhere.

CLEAN WATERS

Do Your Part to Stop the Spread

Clean boats mean clean waters. The DNR reminds you to take these steps to prevent the spread of invasive species every time you leave a launch:

Inspect your boat, trailer and equipment and remove visible aquatic plants, animals and mud.

Drain water from your boat, motor, bilge, live wells and bait containers.

Dispose of leftover bait in the trash, not in the water or on land.

Wash your boat and equipment with high pressure or hot water, or let it dry for five days before heading to another water body.

Visit dnr.wi.gov/invasives/ to learn more about what you can do to keep Wisconsin waterways clean and prevent the spread of invasive species.
