From the President

It's been a wonderful summer on the lake. Great weather for lake enjoyment, although we could have used a little more rain. The lack of rainfall resulted in low water levels which caused a problem getting boats off lifts and getting in and out of some locations on the lake. A couple late summer storms stemmed the decline and water level recovered enough to avoid extended problems.

We found out last spring that the DNR decided to cancel the walleye stocking plans for Nelson Lake this fall. During the last 10 years they have been stocking about 25,000 extended growth walleye fingerlings each odd-number year. Prior to that they stocked about 12,500

every year. The decision to cancel stocking this year was made because they have not been able to confirm sufficient survival rates during the fall electro-fishing surveys.

The DNR has not decided if future stocking will be done so the Board of Directors decided to pursue private stocking. Gordy Christians did some research and found that we could purchase 1,250 large fingerlings from the St.Croix hatchery at a cost of



\$5,000. The Board approved the expenditure and we entered into a contract for delivery this fall. On September 19th the St Croix hatchery delivered 1,308 large walleye fingerlings averaging 6.9 inches long, with many up to 9 inches.

It may be possible that a small number will have better survival rates. If we look at the past years when a lower number were being stocked every year the survival was better than years with large numbers every-other year. Unless the DNR continues doing the electro-fishing surveys in the fall it will be impossible to determine if we have any success, other than by angler reports during the summer. Even then it will be difficult due to the significantly smaller number that we can afford to stock.

Our association has done everything recommended to promote natural walleye recruitment, without any success confirmed by surveys. The efforts have included Fish Sticks, minnow stocking with the walleye, sucker stocking, and one drawdown. The only recommendation remaining to pursue is multiple drawdowns to help remove weed cover from spawning beds. This lake was once a natural walleye factory with 20 times more walleye then we have today. Hopefully we can find some key to success with the walleye population.



AEDs On Nelson Lake Could Save a Life

Hello Nelson Lake Association Members.

This is just a friendly reminder about the AEDs (Automated External Defibrillator) that we have placed around the lake. To our newer members, here's the quick history of the AEDs that are on Nelson Lake. Three years

ago a member of the association who worked for Pioneer Seed was able to get a grant for AEDs to be placed around the Lake. With the help of the Sawyer County Ambulance, 3 units were purchased and placed at resorts on the Lake. Revelles Resort, Nelson Lake Landing, and Park Island Resort are the three resorts that are now housing the AEDs.

The Units are inside and close to the entrance of each resort. They are clearly marked for easy access. These units are available to anyone on the lake that needs them in the case of a cardiac event. Just grab the closest one available. These units will tell you what to do if you were to need it. Just stay calm and listen to the directions.

The association just wants to remind all members that we still have these lifesaving tools available. So next time you are visiting one of the three resorts look for the AEDs and make sure to tell people about them. Remember, you could save a life by using these units.

The Annual Meeting of the Nelson Lake Association membership was held on June

10th, 2023, at the Hayward Veterans Center. There were 57 members in attendance.

The meeting began with a video presentation by Max Wolter, DNR Fisheries Specialist, in which he discussed past results from walleye stocking and changes to the walleye stocking plans. The video



has subsequently been posted on the NLA web site and Facebook for everyone interested to see.

Gordy Christians presented the Lenroot Township Report which summarized the 2022 actions and plans for 2023. The plans included work on various town roads and blacktop around the pavilion at Nelson Lake Park to make it handicapped accessible.

The Treasurer's report by Glenn Rolloff included the financial balances in the association savings certificate and checking account, and membership information which reached 301 in 2022 with 207 already having renewed their 2023 membership at the time of the annual meeting.




the food selections and expressed their continued preference for catering instead of pot luck. We plan to continue catering in the future.




The Minnow Races were once again a popular attraction with 10 participants.
