Cooperation is greatly appreciated.

The old pontoon which was used for the changing of buoys and for Fishing Has No Boundaries events was in tough shape, so the Association upgraded with the purchase of a 1995 model to use for these functions. The old pontoon is listed for sale on Facebook Marketplace.

The earlier swap out of the buoys from summer to ice buoys was necessary this year due to the drawdown and that has been completed.

Turnout at the annual picnic was the best it has ever been with 134 In attendance to enjoy the delicious food, the giveaway of the raffle prizes and, of course, the minnow races. Thanks to all who attended. It's a nice way to show some appreciation to the members for their support of the Association throughout the year.


Information regarding future events on the lake are available on the webpage, on Facebook and email and are posted at the various resorts. Stay tuned and stay in touch.

Annual Meeting by Rick Lindner



The Annual Meeting of the Nelson
Lake Association membership was
held on June 8th, 2024, at the Hayward Veterans Center. There
were 68 members in attendance.

The meeting began with the Lenroot Township Report by Gordy Christians. Pictures of the clearing work at the park were shown. The township also purchased land adjacent to the Gerlach Landing parking lot and plans to expand

the parking and potentially blacktop it in the future. Gordy also explained the need for the 4ft drawdown to repair the boat launching ramp at the Park Landing. He also discussed the activity he has been leading to purchase 9,500 fingerling size walleye for stocking during the summer.

The Treasurer's report by Glenn Rolloff included the financial balances in the association savings certificate and checking account. Over 300 membership renewal forms were sent and many members had already renewed their membership at the time of the annual meeting.

Every year four positions on the NLA Board of Directors are open for election. This year the elections were unique because Rick Lindner stepped down from the position as President and Dale McPherson agreed to assume that office. Harold Burton retired from the position as Vice President and Rick ran for re-election as a candidate to fill that position. The other three candidates for re-election to 3 year board positions were

Jeff Hanson, Mark Schaenzer, and Mike Hallum. There was one year remaining in Harold's term and Scott Wied ran as a new Board member to complete that term. All elections were approved by the membership.

The meeting ended with the announcement of the NLA scholarship going to Erin Ewert (see Scholarship article in this newsletter), and a drawing for two \$25 door prize certificates that can be used at any Nelson Lake Resort. The door prizes were won by Ron Redmond and Ed Flanum.

WALLEYE STOCKING PLAN FOR NELSON LAKE 2024 – 2027

In the spring 2024 NLA newsletter, A walleye stocking plan for Nelson Lake was outlined. The goal is to increase the walleye numbers. On July 11, 2024, 9700 3" fingerlings were planted at a cost of \$7409. The fish were in good condition with no observed mortality.





This is a new approach from the extended growth walleye stocking done in the past. The NLA board has agreed to continue this level and timing for an additional three years.

Kayak Around the Big Island (August 17, 2024)

This year we had 13 participants and 3 dogs on the kayak around the big island. The weather cooperated with a light-winds, overcast skies and temperatures in the 70's. The main group started from the Gerlach boat landing at 10 AM, including paddlers from Tanning Point Road. Two additional paddlers joined in

route at Norway Point. We made the turn at Eagle Pass and took a short break for water and snacks. We paddled together as a group the entire way.
